SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information

In case of accident or unwellness, seek medical advice immediately (show directions for use or safety data sheet if possible).

Take off immediately all contaminated clothing.

First aider: Pay attention to self-protection!

After inhalation

In case of accident by inhalation: remove casualty to fresh air and keep at rest. If breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration. Where appropriate artificial ventilation. If unconscious place in recovery position and seek medical advice. In case of respiratory tract irritation, consult a physician.

After contact with skin

Take off immediately all contaminated clothing. After contact with skin, wash immediately with plenty of water. After contact with molten product, cool skin area rapidly with cold water. Do not peel solidified product off the skin. Call a physician immediately.

Burns caused by molten material must be treated clinically.

After contact with eyes

Cold product: Rinse immediately carefully and thoroughly with eye-bath or water. If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention.

Hot product: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Call a physician immediately.

After ingestion

Call a physician immediately. Rinse mouth immediately and drink plenty of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person or a person with cramps. Do NOT induce vomiting.

7.1. Precautions for safe handling

The temperature of the bitumen must be at least 30 °C below the flash point and must never exceed the recommended temperature of 190 °C.

Keep away from sources of ignition. - No smoking. When hot, product develops flammable vapours.

Appropriate engineering controls

Provide adequate ventilation as well as local exhaust at critical locations.

Protective and hygiene measures

Always close containers tightly after the removal of product. When using do not eat, drink, smoke, sniff. Wash hands before breaks and after work. Remove contaminated clothing immediately and dispose off safely. Wash contaminated clothing prior to re-use. Used working clothes should not be worn outside the work area. Street clothing should be stored separately from work clothing.

Eye/face protection

Hot/molten product: If splashing is likely, full head and face protection (protective shield and/or safety goggles) should be used. Product at ambient temperature (dust): safety goggles.

For loading/unloading operations: wear safety helmet with integrated full face visor and neck protection.

Hand protection

Wear suitable gloves. DIN EN 374
Heat resistant gloves with long cuffs, or gauntlets.
Before using check leak tightness / impermeability. In the case of wanting to use the gloves again, clean them before taking off and air them well.
The selected protective gloves have to satisfy the specifications of EU Directive 89/686/EEC and the standard EN 374 derived from it.

Skin protection

Wear protective clothing for operations with hot material: heat resistant coveralls (with trousers legs over boots and sleeves over cuffs of gloves), heat resistant heavy duty antiskid boots (e. g. leather).
